Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the Stroke Recovery Guide website?

Strokerecovery.guide is a new mobile-friendly website based on *My Guide for Stroke Recovery* (MGSR), a resource binder provided to persons with stroke and families/caregivers in Toronto. The website is designed so that persons with stroke and families/caregivers can easily find information and answers for common concerns after stroke. The website is intended to enhance persons with stroke's ability to self-manage their recovery

2. What information can I find on [strokerecovery.guide](http://Strokerecovery.guide)?

Content related to stroke prevention, living with the effects of stroke and getting back to life after stroke. Each topic may include information, strategies, videos, pictures and links to community resources.

3. When can [strokerecovery.guide](http://Strokerecovery.guide) be used?

It can be used at any point during the stroke recovery journey. This may include acute care, rehabilitation and in the community.

4. How can [strokerecovery.guide](http://Strokerecovery.guide) be introduced to persons with stroke and families/caregivers?

- Consider showing the website in an area frequented by persons with stroke and families/caregivers, such as the patient lounge or library;
- Bookmark [strokerecovery.guide](http://Strokerecovery.guide) as a favourite webpage on a shared computer;
- Encourage people to explore the website on their tablets or smartphones;
- Display the Toronto Stroke Networks' [Communique](#) and paper bookmark about [strokerecovery.guide](http://Strokerecovery.guide) in a visible area.
